Overseers' Seminar

In line with The WECA Training policy that stipulates two training sessions for District Overseers within a year, an Overseers' Retreat was held between November training November 20 and 24, 2012.

Activities started with Preliminary meetings of the Board of Trustees and Regional Overseers to discuss relevant issues. In his opening speech on the first day general meeting, the District Superintendent emphasized the importance of the Seminar, relating present day Church development to the time of rebuilding Jerusalem's broken wall in Nehemiah's time. The First Seminar focused on administrative restructuring. The seminar objectives include methods of reducing cumulative deficit in

management, gaining stability and efficiency in administration, discovering hidden talents in our midst, employing synergy in our work and improving functionality in specific areas. All these are designed to bring Glory to the Church.

Day 2 activities commenced with a Faith clinic followed by a Seminar on Planning and Programming. Participants were divided into Strategic Groups to brainstorm on developing Human Capacity, Restructuring, Evangelism, Church Welfare and Worship issues. Each group was expected to present papers on these Core Issues of our Organization. The afternoon session was handled by a facilitator that refreshed participants on fund mobilization, key fac-

tors in Budgeting and elements involved in financial reporting. Seminars on Conflict and office management were delivered by The District Superintendent on the third day of the events. He also intimated participants on some attempts by fraudsters to swindle Church Officers, Caution is very necessary in financial dealings to the public. Prompt police report is also very essential in managing criminal activities, unforeseen accidents and communal crisis. Interpersonal and administrative conflicts management was discussed using practical examples. The three day seminar came to a close on Friday and participants returned to their bases on Saturday morning.
