REVIVAL IN OKE-SAKI AREA OF OYO STATE

It had been in our hearts to propagate the Gospel in Oyo North Local Government Area, in particular Igboho and Saki.

A maiden trip, which could be called an awareness programme, had been made to the area before the 2002 camp meeting. The evidence seen in the number of delegates that attended the last camp meeting from Oke-Ogun. A total of 30 people were in attendance. The Lord used this to encourage us to launch out again into the area.

On October 19, 2002, a 18 member Gospel team, left Ibadan for Igboho, where a one-week revival services started on the following Sunday. Before the arrival of the team, God had reserved a special building, hidden among the weeds to accommodate the team. The leader insisted on clearing the surrounding of the building, not knowing that a well was in the compound. God kept the workers from falling into the hidden well and when later there was a shortage of water, the well became useful to both the Gospel team members and the villagers.

Brethren from Oyo, Ogbomosho and Ikirun joined at Igboho to reinforce the efforts of the team from Ibadan. Services

were held from Monday to Saturday, except Wednesday when there was a film show. At the end of the first Sunday, 6 people were saved.

Meetings were also held at Saki. God used a non-member to supply the need of the team for accommodation. A courtesy call was paid to the traditional ruler, the Oke-Saki, and the Xebi. The Xebi warmly received. There was a restoration of Mr. James Oladoja, an octogenarian who had come across the Gospel at the inception of The Apostolic Faithwork in Nigeria. He later donated a plot of land for a Church building. The meetings in both towns were greatly blessed with a total of 33 souls being saved, 9 sanctified and 4 baptized with the Holy Ghost and fire.

Testimonies from the saints of God in our services prove that our God answers prayers. A brother testified that he had sought the baptism of the Holy Ghost for a long time without any result. One day, God reminded him of the school locker which he stole and the unpaid levies which he evaded while in school. He quickly made provision for a new locker and paid what he owed the school. After restituting his way, as he was preparing to go to his farm one Thursday morning, the Spirit of God urged him to pray. Within a few minutes, the Holy Ghost descended mightily and baptised him.

ANNUAL CONCERTS

There are usually three concerts presented annually in Lagos by the combined Choir and Orchestra. They are: Easter Concert on Easter Sunday, the Camp Meeting Concert on the first Monday of the annual camp meeting, and the Christmas concert on the Sunday before the Christmas Day. Other states in Nigeria and countries in Africa hold their own concerts at convenient dates.

The anthems of praise sung from consecrated hearts, and the music skilfully played with spiritual fervour, have been effectively used by the Spirit of God. Souls have been led to Christ as a result of attending the concerts.

MUSIC DIRECTION

The Apostolic Faith Orchestra which was pioneered by a small group of musicians, was organised by the Rev. T. G. Oshokoya. He personally directed the instrumental and vocal groups for a number of years.

The present Music Director, John Adelaja Aina, started playing the organ when he was young. He found great pleasure in dedicating his talents and time to the service of the Lord. As the principal organist, he has served for more than 35 years in the Music Department.

QUALIFICATIONS

Music lovers in the city of Lagos and other localities attend these concerts and thoroughly enjoy the sacred and semi-classical presentations. Sometimes, up to 21,000 people attend each concert; among whom are: government officials, academics, traditional rulers and diplomats.

The principle which was originally established in the beginning of this work still remains. Only those who have the genuine experience of Salvation, who are also truly sanctified and filled with the Holy Ghost, take part in the ministry of music and singing.

The Founder, the Rev. (Mrs.) Florence Crawford, was a songwriter. One of her well-loved hymns was composed shortly after she had established this Gospel work in Portland. Under the burden of severe trial, she put into verse the craving of her soul

Her son, Rev. Raymond Robert Crawford, also composed a number of Gospel songs. A special burden came upon his heart, to write a hymn which gave admonition for prayer. Then, as now, there was a special need for prevailers, and the Lord gave to him the stirring words of the hymn:

*The organ we hallow to Thee,
O hear thy servants as they pray,
And let Thine ear attentive be.*

Others who wrote songs at the International Headquarters included Brothers Philip Brown and Clifford Baltzell. On the continent of Africa, God gave talents to individuals who yielded their lives to compose and arrange music for the Choir and Orchestra in English, French and many local languages. Notable among these who poured out his burdened soul for the Word of God on the continent of Africa, when he turned the wordings of *Thessalonians 3:16* into a song. His successor, Rev. Josiah Soyinka was inspired to give out the words of a song for the dedication of the Johannus organ, the first verse of which was:

God Did it For Me

A prophet finds the True Light



I was born into a Muslim family in Igboho, Oyo State of Nigeria. Although I attended a Baptist primary school, my mother soon took me to a Fulani cattle camp for protection because of the polygamous nature of our family. There, I was taught the deep things of the Moslem religion and that Jesus was not the Son of God. I used to confront Christians openly and this made my co-Muslims admire my zeal and courage.

However, within me I was very restless and fearful of the Judgment Day, which I believed was soon to come. I knew that judgment would come upon all wicked men, but I did not know the way of escape from the judgment. Sometimes, I would read the Bible and start to weep without understanding what was happening to me.

One glorious day, during the Ramadan period in 1977, as I was preparing to pray according to Islamic injunctions on a sheepskin, I

heard a strange voice as loud as the sound of many waters. The voice called my Muslim name three times. I was very perplexed and looked up and saw a thick cloud in the sky. There was nobody in the cloud but I heard a voice saying Christ; Mohammed that you are serving cannot lead you to Heaven. Stop deceiving yourself. Ask anything in my Name and I will do it melted. That was the last time I bowed my head to worship God in the Islamic way.

Although, I did not immediately start to serve God the right way, God revealed His power to me soon after. I had a motorcycle accident that almost took my life. I could not move my left leg. In fact, I was almost paralysed. My parents tried all they could, but all the medication given to me did not have any effect.

At a certain stage, I remembered me on the sheepskin. I then asked everyone in the room to leave because I wanted to speak to that tant at first, they finally gave in to and to my utter consternation, I was instantly healed. I ran outside, and people could not believe what they saw. Although this incident convinced me of the reality of Jesus, I still did not know how to serve Him properly.

For a long time, I remained without any religion. One day, the Voice of God asked me to leave the environment in which I was and to proceed to Mòkwa, in State of Nigeria. I eventually settled down in Ilorin on June 6, 1979. Although the sermon I heard in the first Church it attended pricked my heart and I became terrified, at the end of the service I was only asked to raise up my hand as a sign of surrender to Jesus and I was saved. I became very zealous in the work of the Lord in the Church but my zeal was without knowledge. I later joined a few other people to start a Pentecostal Church. I was very eloquent in preaching, yet, there was sin in my heart. I was bothered because of my bad temper and love of money, but I did not know what to do. After sometime, I became a Senior Evangelist and I started my own Church. I sought for power and I got power. I soon started practising signs and wonders as well as falling anointing of situation in which you throw an handkerchief to a member or you touch him and he falls down. The dead were raised, the blind received their sight and the lepers were cleansed at the Name of Jesus. But because I was not genuinely saved from my life of sin, problems upon problems mounted in my life.

After a while, I was ill and became unconscious for three days. (Continued on page 11)

My people took me to a white garment Church and through the mercy of God I became well again. While recuperating in the Church, I learnt more of their mode of worship. I became filled with their spirit even more than the people I met there. I could prophesy evil occurrences and some strange spirits filled me. My hair became dread locked and grew down to my shoulders within a few hours, which was a sign of my becoming a prophet. I was given two staffs of office, one as a Prophet and the other as a King. My future and it came to pass. I read all kinds of spiritual books and their spirits fell on me. But I had no peace. I was restless and confused. At one stage, I thought my wife was the one blocking my success in my prophetic career. I drove her out and married another wife.

The Lord started to deal with me. Although I could predict the evil that would befall others, I could not predict the evil that was happening to me. I became seriously ill. The people who took care of me stole all my money. I was in great torment and though I wished to die, death would not come. For some inexplicable reasons, I woke up at 12.00 midnight everyday. A voice would tell me to start weeping and I would cry till 6.00 a.m. In the morning, people would still come to me to foretell their future. My second wife then introduced me to another white garment Church, which she said could relieve me of my problems, but my case got worse. I was told that if I could go to a certain deep river to take a stone from the river bed and rub my body with it, I would be well. All these efforts came to naught.

I was told that I should organize crusades and by so doing, I would become well, but it was all to no avail.

Eventually, due to my confusion, I drove away my second wife. But thanks be to God, I got an invitation to come and hold revival services in Jebba. One day, as I was in front of the house I resided in at Jebba, I saw some Apostolic Faith members, including their Pastor coming towards me. My host told me right there a lot of discouraging things about them. When they got near us, the Pastor invited me to their Church but I immediately refused. However, my inquisitive mind got the better of me and I went to see what they were doing on a Thursday Bible Study. People kept on telling me to stop attending the Church, but a Power stronger than me kept taking me there. I started reading their Higher Way magazine and Sermons. I was struck with the fact that their doctrines which dated back to 1906, were still being practised by the people I saw there. I kept asking the Pastor questions and the answers I got were so marvellous that, just as the Queen of Sheba felt, there was no more spirit in me.

One day, the burden of sin became too heavy for me to bear and within our compound I started pacing up and down, asking Jesus to lift my burden of sin. Oh, the joy of salvation! All my burdens rolled away. I could laugh, and did laugh, even though I had not laughed for ten years. That day I slept soundly. I was so thrilled that I ran to the Pastor to tell him what had happened. He told me about the doctrine of sanctification and the baptism of the Holy Ghost and fire. The Lord sanctified and baptized me

and I spoke in a new tongue. I had spoken in many strange tongues before and even prided myself in the fact that I understood the language of birds, but this was a different experience.

I started making restitutions and concoctions that I was making for people. I threw away the staffs of office. I burnt my magic books which turned into mystic smoke.

I have had many problems since I got saved but God solved all of them. God told me never to leave the Apostolic Faith Church. When I started wondering why, God showed me a vision. I saw the Apostolic Faith as a Church built with palm fronds. It was not at all attractive outside. In that vision, God told me to enter. Inside, I saw that everywhere was paved with gold. God told me that, that was the way to Heaven and that I must stay there. I have not had any cause whatsoever to regret since my conversion. The love of the brethren is always there, but Christ is my ultimate satisfaction. I will remain in this Gospel till the end of my life.
